

THE BIOGRAPHY



REVEREND DR. MARCUS L. LEATHERS

Faith forged from the nurture of family, strengthened in the study of God's word, and sharpened in service to the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), in partnership with ecumenical entities, and in outreach to the Beloved Community.

Marcus Levon Leathers, a second-generation Disciples of Christ, born in Eastern NC, is the son of Levon Leathers and the late Carolyn Leathers and the middle sibling of sister, Shelia, and brother, Malcolm. Marcus was baptized at age 9 at St. Luke Church of Christ (DOC) in Princeville, NC, where his family was active for many years. Marcus is the husband of Tammi C. Leathers and father of Coleman Marcus Levon (deceased), Madison Danielle, and Maxwell Hunter MacKenzie.

As a Chemistry student at NC State University, Marcus realized his true passion was for the Church and Christian ministry. After graduating and marrying Tammi Michelle Coleman, he soon began Master of Divinity (MDiv) courses at Lexington Theological Seminary in Lexington, KY. As a student minister at East Second Street Christian Church (DOC), Marcus trained with the pastor, Reverend Raymond L. Brown, who became a lifelong friend and mentor. Alos, he served as a chaplain intern at the Christian Church Homes of Kentucky in Louisville. Upon earning his MDiv degree, Marcus was ordained by the Christian Church (DOC) in NC. He has served in the following ministerial capacities:

- Pastor, Midway Church of Christ (DOC), Tazewell, VA, 1993-1996.
- Assistant to the Pastor, Michigan Park Christian Church (DOC), Washington, DC, 1997-1999.
- Pastor, Shepherd Park Christian Church (DOC), Washington, DC, 1999-2016.
- Pastor for Congregational Care & Development, United Christian Parish, Reston, VA, 2017-2023.

Commitment to social justice has been a focus of Marcus' work, specifically, his participation in the Reconciliation Ministry initiative, Many Members One Table, with Reverend Dr. William "Chris" Hobgood, former CCCA Regional Minister, in 1999. This began a relationship of nearly twenty years as a facilitator of reconciliation, including a two year apprenticeship with Crossroads Ministry's Pro-Reconciliation/Anti-Racism enabling him to serve as one of the four initial Core Trainers/Organizers for Reconciliation Ministry, a General Ministry of the Christian Church (DOC), a role he continued until late 2023.

In consideration of Evangelism through Art in Service to the Sacred, Marcus completed the Arts and Theology track of the Doctor in Ministry (DMin) program at Wesley Theological Seminary in 2009, a study influencing his work within CCCA congregations and their communities. Marcus' participation with the Disciples Center for Public Witness, a faith-based justice ministry of the CCCA advocating and organizing for public policies and laws promoting greater justice for all. In recognition of his commitment to community service through Christian ministry, in January 2021, Marcus was presented with the Bridge Builders Award.

In August 2023, Marcus was called to be the Regional Minister of the Christian Church (DOC) in the Capital Area. In accepting his call, Marcus has renewed his commitment to work on behalf of the people and the community he has loved and who have likewise loved him and his family. He is honored to accept this call-understanding that it doesn't solely rest with him but has been guided by the host of witnesses from the past, will be supported by the faithful leadership of the present, and is for the benefit of the great manifestation of Jesus' Church in the future.

Rev. Terri Hord Owens: (to all gathered) Will you pray for the Capital Area Region in the days ahead to be faithful to its' calling to preach the Good News of Jesus Christ? Will you offer your gifts of ministry to God's purposes, as you are able, that the church may grow in love and unity? Will you support the ministry of the region with your good words, hopes and resources that lives may be touched in this place and around the world with God's saving grace? If so, will you please answer, with God's help, we will.

All: With God's help, we will.

Rev. Terri Hord Owens: Congregation, you may be seated. Having heard the promises shared this day we rejoice that God has given us one another for the days ahead and the ministry before us. In the name of Jesus, the Christ, and by the grace of God, as General Minister and President, I hereby install you, Rev. Dr. Marcus Leathers as the Regional Minister of the Capital Area Region. I pray God's blessing be upon you and God's ministry be done through you and through this community of faith as you bear witness to the Gospel.
